


## MEET CHARLES TYRRELL





<b>Building Now:</b> Draw a building below (like a castle, school, or the museum).	Building + Nature: Draw the same building but show how nature might reclaim it over time – add plants growing on it, animals making homes, and changes from weather.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Many animals adapt to live alongside humans! Swallows build nests on buildings, foxes live in cities, and plants grow in the smallest cracks in pavements. *Try at home:* Draw your home with plants growing all over it, like a building turning into a garden!









### **EXHIBITION EXPLORERS: MEET STONEY ROAD PRESS**

Stoney Road Press is a special **print studio** in **Dublin** where artists work together with master printmakers to create beautiful limited-edition artworks.

#### WHAT IS A PRINT?

A print is made when an artist creates a design on one surface (like metal, wood, or stone), covers it with ink, and then presses it onto paper. This way, they can make several copies of the same artwork!

#### LOOK OUT FOR:

- Numbers like 3/25 in the corner of prints this means it's print number 3 out of 25 made
- The artist's signature
- Different textures and layers created by the printing process

**ABOUT THE EXHIBITION:** On Paper with Stoney Road Press features works by Diana Copperwhite, Blaise Drummond, Brian Harte, Mark Joyce, and Charles Tyrrell. Originally curated for the Amsterdam Art on Paper Fair 2024, the exhibition celebrates the artistic process of collaboration through print.
